BIRKAT HAMAZON: ALTERNATE WORDINGS

BA'ALAT HABAYIT HAZEH

Ba'alat HaBayit HaZeh: Woman Head of Household Say <u>ba'alat ha'bayit ha'zeh</u> if the head of the household is a woman.

BRACHA MERUBA BABAYIT HAZEH

Bracha Meruba BaBayit HaZeh: Inside Jewish Home

Say <u>bracha meruba ba'bayit ha'zeh</u> only when eating in a house or apartment that is occupied by a Jewish family or a Jewish owned public building.

Bracha Meruba BaBayit HaZeh: Outside Jewish Home

If eating outside a Jewish home, including when eating outdoors, say (instead of *bracha meruba...*): *Ha'rachaman hu yishlach lanu bracha meruba b'halichateinu uv'yeshivateinu ad olam.*

MIGDOL OR MAGDIL

Birkat HaMazon on Musaf Days: Migdol or Magdil

Say migdol (yeshuot) on days when we say musaf (on other days, say magdil).

Birkat HaMazon Once Shabbat Ends: Migdol or Magdil When saying <u>birkat ha'mazon</u> after <u>Shabbat</u> until halachic midnight (<u>chatzot</u>), say migdol, not magdil.

NOTE This also applies to *birkat ha'mazon* after *Jewish festivals* or *Rosh Chodesh-*-all days when we say *musaf*.

VE'AL SHULCHAN ZEH SHEACHALNU ALAV

Ve'al Shulchan Zeh SheAchalnu Alav When Alone

Say <u>she'achalnu</u> (in the plural) even if you are alone.

Ve'al Shulchan Zeh SheAchalnu Alav If No Table Skip <u>ve'al shulchan zeh she'achalnu alav</u> if there is no table.
