## Jewish Festivals: Ending: Before Havdala: Baruch HaMavdil and Birkat HaMazon

Saying <u>Baruch ha'mavdil bein kodesh l'chol</u> after dark at the end of a <u>Jewish festival</u> or of <u>Rosh</u> Hashana does not affect the additions you will then say in <u>birkat ha'mazon</u>.

On a <u>Jewish festival</u> afternoon, you washed your hands, said <u>ha'motzi</u>, and started eating. It is now dark and the end of the <u>Jewish festival</u>.

WHAT TO DO You may say Baruch ha'mavdil bein kodesh l'chol and do melacha, and then

- Continue to eat your meal, or
- Say <u>birkat ha'mazon</u> INCLUDING <u>ya'aleh v'yavo</u> and <u>ha'rachaman hu</u> yanchileinu yom she'kulo tov.
