HOSTING GUESTS (HACHNASAT ORCHIM)

To Whom To Give Food and Lodging

We are commanded to give food and accommodation (<u>hachnasat orchim</u>) to people who do not have food to eat or a place to sleep. This applies to any day, not just to <u>Shabbat</u> and <u>Jewish festivals</u>.

Inviting Friends for Meals

Inviting friends to your house for meals, even on <u>Shabbat</u> and <u>Jewish festivals</u>, is not <u>hachnasat orchim</u>-unless the friends do not have food or a place to sleep. But inviting friends for meals may qualify as other <u>mitzyot</u>.

Accompanying a Guest

You should walk a guest to the door or even along his/her way when he/she leaves your home. This is an act of kindness (*chesed*).
