PASSOVER: CHOL HAMOED AND ENDING DAY(S): BLESSINGS FOR MATZA BREI

Matza Brei Blessing

The blessing on <u>matza.brei</u> is <u>mezonot</u>, as long as the pieces of <u>matza</u> are smaller than 1.3 fl. oz. (39 ml, or 1/6 cup) each. If even one of the pieces is larger than 1.3 fl. oz., wash your hands and say <u>ha'motzi</u> before eating it.

PASSOVER: ENDING DAY(S): SHEHECHEYANU

Passover: Ending Day(s): SheHecheyanu

Do not say <u>she'hecheyanu</u> when lighting candles or saying <u>kiddush</u> on the last two days of <u>Passover</u> outside of <u>Eretz Yisrael</u> or the last day of <u>Passover</u> in <u>Eretz Yisrael</u>.

NOTE These are the only Jewish festival days on which she'hecheyanu is not said.

PASSOVER: CHOL HAMOED AND ENDING DAY(S): HALLEL

Shortened Hallel on Seventh Day of Passover

We omit parts of two of hallel's psalms on chol ha'moed and the seventh (and eighth) day(s) of Passover.

REASON The Egyptians drowned on the seventh day. We thus dampen our celebration of God's saving

us because we feel sorry that people had to die, even though they were evil.

NOTE Since <u>chol ha'moed</u> is less important than the final days of *Passover*, we diminish <u>hallel</u> on

chol ha'moed by omitting the same passages.

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
