Jewish Festivals: Personal Eruv Tavshilin

One person per household should make an <u>eruv tavshilin</u> in order to allow cooking on a <u>Jewish</u> <u>festival</u> for the next day, if the next day is <u>Shabbat</u>. The person sets aside something cooked and something baked and says a formula (which can be found in most <u>siddurs</u>).

NOTE An <u>eruv tavshilin</u> made by one person covers everyone in that household, including guests staying over for that <u>Jewish festival</u>--even if he or she did not intend it to cover anyone else.
