Jewish Wedding: Witnesses: Four Pairs

A Jewish wedding requires four pairs of witnesses, but the same witnesses may be used for all four parts: *tanayim; ketuba; kiddushin; yichud*. Each witness must be:

- A shomer-Shabbat, adult male,
- Not related to the bride or groom,
- Not related to each other, and
- Known to be an honest person.
- NOTE There is no requirement to have only people who were born into <u>shomer-Shabbat</u> families as witnesses.
