Precedence of Mitzvot

A frequently performed commandment generally takes precedence over a less frequently performed commandment, but ONLY:

- Regarding the order in which they are to be performed, and
- If there is no specific reason to do the less frequent one.

If you are only able to do one of several commandments, do the most important one.

| EXAMPLE | If you can only put on either <i>talit</i> or <i>tefilin</i> , you would put on the <i>tefilin</i> since that is |

| ANOTHER | Friday before sunset when <i>Chanuka</i> will be on <i>Shabbat</i> lighting <i>Shabbat</i> candles is |
| EXAMPLE | done more frequently, but we light the Chanuka candles first since if we lit the |
| | Shabbat candles first, it would already be Shabbat and we could not light the Chanuka |
| | candles at all. |
