Jewish Festivals: Acquisitions

You may not acquire items (<u>kinyan</u>) on <u>Jewish festivals</u> unless they are needed for that <u>Jewish festival</u> or for a <u>mitzva</u>. The classic example is bringing food or wine to a house for <u>Jewish festival</u> lunch, which the house owner acquires on the <u>Jewish festival</u> for the <u>Jewish festival</u>. Other permissible <u>kinyan</u> on <u>Jewish festivals</u> is giving:

- Siddur, machzor, or chumash to use on that day.
- Permissible medicine for use on that day.

On bringing mail or a newspaper into your house on <u>Jewish festivals</u>, see <u>Jewish Festivals</u>: Bringing Mail inside House and <u>Jewish Festivals</u>: Bringing Newspaper inside House.
